Members of the Virtual Thunderbirds attend the 2011 Consumer Electronics Show in support of Thrustmaster

2011 brought new opportunities, for the Virtual Thunderbirds to act in support of corporate sponsor, Thrustmaster, as they attended the 2011 Consumer Electronics Show in Las Vegas, Nevada. Virtual Thunderbird team members Allen Hartford



and Todd MacLeod were on hand for the four-day convention as product demonstration specialists for Thrustmaster's latest gaming platform, the HOTAS Warthog. Product demonstration was accomplished through the use of SC Simulations' A-10 cockpit demonstrator and Eagle Dynamics' latest software release, DCS: A-10C.
